Year 1

Fall Semester – 8 Weeks each Course

September – November

BIB – 100: Origin of the Bible - 3 credits

This course is a study of the history of the Bible from the time of the first written documents until the modern English translations. In discovering the authenticity of the Bible, the general themes include the development of the Old Testament, the development of the New Testament, the transmission of the text, and the modern English versions of the Bible.

LHIS – 101: The Black Church - 3 credits

This course is a survey of black religious movements, including the black church. The history of black religious movements in America originated in Africa. We will then examine the religion of the slaves, the beginning of the black church movement, and the de-Christianization of the black church. This course will provide an overview of the multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary components of the Black Christian experience in America. Students who will lead contemporary African American churches, will receive a rich historical, theological, ethical, and sociological foundational experience. This course presents an academic perspective as a foundation for ministry and church leadership.

This course will focus on the study of what is most sacred in the Jewish faith and the Torah which includes the first five books of the Hebrew Bible. These books include Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. Focusing on the beginning of creation which will cover 2,300 years of Biblical history, the redemption of Israel from Egypt, and continuing with the foundation of the rest of the biblical tradition.

January - March

OT – 102: Books of History- 3 credits

This course will acquaint students with the history, theology, and critical study of the Former Prophets of the Old Testament: Joshua, Judges, Samuel, and Kings. The focus is the proper interpretation of its message to Israel and its abiding significance for the church. This introductory course will discuss the many strands of liberation theology from different global contexts. The focus will be on liberation theology's methodologies, its relation to the social context, and its challenges to the theological discipline. This course explores Christian Liberation Theologies and their critics. After an initial consideration of the common characteristics of various liberation theologies and their European and North American precursors, the course will give sustained attention to liberation theologies in Africa and Latin America, and their relationship to revolutionary political struggles in those contexts. Throughout, the focus will be on careful attention to classic liberationists texts and reflection.

Special attention to the historical foundation of Old Testament prophecy, the theme and role of each prophet, divine judgment and salvation to the believer, and God's plan for Israel and the nations for all generations.

Special attention to Messianic prophecies involving Christ and the Church, prophetic ministry, and the personal application of these timeless truths. This course covers all twelve of the Minor Prophets: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi.
